Hope everyone is enjoying the fall weather.

# LADIES AUXILIARY NEWS: KATHY LOHMAN, SECRETARY

Here's a little change up this month from the usual article. How about some fall recipes to warm our stomachs and appetites!

#### AUTUMN CHOPPED SALAD 4 cups romaine lettuce, chopped 1 Bartlett pear, diced 1 red apple, diced Bacon bits 1/4 cup dried cranberries 1/4 cup chopped pecans 1/4 cup feta cheese \*Toss all together with a poppyseed dressing.

NO BAKE PUMPKIN PIE9 inch graham cracker crust1 tsp cinnamon½ tsp ginger½ tsp nutmeg½ tsp salt14 oz. Sweetened condensedmilk2 beaten eggs15 oz pumpkin1 pkg Knox unflavored gelatin

\*In saucepan combine gelatin, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger, salt. Stir in condensed milk, eggs, mix well. Let stand one minute. Then on low heat, stir constantly (about 10 min) until gelatin is dissolved and mixture thickens. Remove from heat. Stir in pumpkin, mix thoroughly. Pour into graham cracker crust. Chill at least 3 hours before

serving. Don't forget the whip cream!

#### <u>MUSHROOM/PUMPKIN</u> SOUP

½ lb mushrooms sliced
½ chopped onions
2 tbsp butter or oil
2 tbsp flour
Add curry to taste
3 cups chicken broth
1 lb can of pumpkin
1 tbsp honey
Dash nutmeg
Salt/pepper to taste
1 cup evaporated milk
Optional sour cream or yogurt

#### for topping

\*Saute mushrooms and onions in butter/oil. Add flour and curry and stir, gradually add chicken broth. Add all other ingredients except milk and cook, stirring for 10-15 minutes. Add milk and heat through without boiling. Top with sour cream or yogurt if desired. YUMMY!

## **KLOSTERMANN NAMED TO HALL OF FAME**

Martin Klostermann, along with his 7 brothers and 1 sister, was raised on the family farm north of Highland, IL. He attended Immaculate Conception Grade School in Pierron and graduated from St Paul High School in Highland. After graduating from tech school in Louisville, KY, he served in the US Army, 82nd Airborne Division at Ft Bragg, NC. for 2 years.

He met his future wife while on leave and after being discharged from the army moved to the Chicago suburbs. In June 1974, Martin married his wife, Kyle Audrey, in Elmhurst, IL. They are the parents of two daughters, Karen (Paul) Hemenway and Kendra (passed away in 2017) and have three grandchildren, Matthew, Jacob and Sophia.

In 1992, Martin joined the Knights of Columbus, Msgr. Henry Schryer Council 654 in Elgin, IL. While with Council 654, he chaired the Intellectual Disability fundraiser, the Bar-B-Que raffle and served as Treasurer.

Martin and his family

moved to Highland, IL in 1998 and he soon became an active member of Highland Council 1580 working many projects and events and serving as co-chairman of the ID fundraiser. He served as Warden (one year); Chancellor (one year); Deputy Grand Knight (one year); Grand Knight (two years); Trustee (four years); and is currently serving his 10th year as Financial Secretary. He is a member of 4th Degree Assembly 231 and serves in the Honor Guard

During his time as Grand (2008-2010), he Knight, formed a recruitment committee and grew the Council by 68 members. Currently he is chairing the committee for the school renovation project and managing the church and school landscape proj-The past years have ects. seen him serve 6 years on Pastoral Council and volunteer at the Kirchenfest, St Paul's annual church picnic.
