

We know firsthand the panic that went through many as we saw shortages of toilet paper among other things last year due

I remember when I was growing up and the siren sounded to alarm us of a severe storm or tornado on the horizon, my parents and siblings gathered in a safe place of the house (sometimes it was on my parents' bed), lit blessed candles and prayed the Rosary together until the danger passed. So even today when there's a se-

vere storm, I do the same. I grab my Rosary and light candles and pray for safety for all.

So let us remember that it is a good thing to plan and prepare for possible disasters, but it is even better to care for our souls before our personal comfort. Let us not be caught unaware. For though we may have warnings of storms or other possible looming catastrophes, we will not necessarily have warning of our personal end time. "...the Lord will come like a thief at night." 1Thessalonians 5:2. We must prepare ourselves for His coming.


