At the meeting:

- Informed members that we had recently had the ballfield pavilion roof repaired by Jack Holthaus.
- Also that we would have an election in Nov for the Columbus Club Board seat being vacated by Ken Klosterman. Craig Wieseman is the chair of this nominating committee.
- We voted to proceed with a bid from Langhauser Sheet Metal to replace 3 of the 4 heat exchangers on the west side of the hall.

The heat exchangers have been in need of replacement for a couple years now. The 4th had failed about 3 years ago and was replaced at that time.

Langhauser is able to do this relatively soon with available materi-

als. With winter coming soon, and supply shortages in a lot of places, it was pretty quick yes vote.

- At the end of the meeting we received the good news that the Council received a grant from the Highland Area Community Foundation to assist in the handicapped access project. So this means that funding will be available for automatic doors at the entrance of the hall, enabling better access for those who need it at many events.

Thanks go out to the Highland Area Community Foundation. More details to come as bids are made for the work.


