Everyone Invited To Silver Rose Ceremony

The Silver Rose is coming to Highland's St. Paul Church. Beginning back in April of 2015, six silver roses began their journey across North America from Canada to the United States to Mexico.

The 2015 Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose – One Life, One Rose Program concludes on December 12, 2015 on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. Highland Knights of Columbus Council 1580 is pleased to announce that the Silver Rose Prayer Program will be coming to the St. Paul Parish Community on August 4th, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. This prayer program focuses on the events of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Miracle of the Roses. The route of the third silver rose, (which will be arriving at St. Paul Church) originates in Manitoba, moving south through the central United States along the Mississippi before turning to Texas.

Since 1960, the Silver Rose Program, originally called Operation Rose, has gathered Knights and Columbian Squires from Mexico, the United States and Canada. In the mid - 1990's, the Silver Rose Program was adopted as a Supreme Council initiative and has grown to encompass multiple pilgrimage routes. Our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said that this is "a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus. Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society.

As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the Roses." Everyone is invited to attend this beautiful program.
