PLEASE.....THANK YOU......I'M SORRY.....

Three very small phrases in the whole of the English language. Ever think how many times you might say them in the course of a day? Studies have shown that the average person can speak up to 16,000 words a day. I guess a lot depends on whether we live alone or with others; work outside the home and what type of work we do; and how much interaction with other people we have. So thinking about all the words we say in a day, I wonder how many of them were please, thank you and I'm sorry?

These little words are ones that carry a lot of weight and influence in our lives and the lives of those who cross our paths each day. Adding the word "please" shows respect for other people; respect for their lives and their time; it does not assume their response to our request. It shows that we value their consideration; and let's be honest, it usually gets us better results!

Followed up with "thank you", what better way to show appreciation for what was received or promised or done; gratitude for their time sacrificed for us; for an act of kindness or a simple gesture, for their advice or counsel. These two phrases, "please" and "thank you", should always be paired and never separated.

Probably the hardest words to

say are "Tm sorry", but they also may have the biggest impact. We all have said or done things for which we are sorry and it's definitely a lesson in humility to express this aloud to others. It's a lesson in forgiveness—forgiving ourselves, asking for forgiveness, and granting forgiveness to others. Let's be mindful of how many times we use these words throughout the day. We can even say them in one sentence if needed: "Tm sorry; please forgive me; thank you".

These three phrases are also important when we talk to God. Are we saying "please with our prayers of petition? Are we remembering to say "thank you" when our prayers are answered? We can even say thank you along with our petitions thanking God for however He will answer our prayers or work in our lives. Are we telling God "Tm sorry" when we know we have fallen short of His expectations for us? We can even combine them all in one prayer: "Lord, I'm sorry; please forgive me; thank you".

It's that wonderful time of year when we prepare for Christ's coming. Let's be sure to take time out of our shopping, baking, decorating, and partying to pray and contemplate how we will truly celebrate Jesus coming into our lives this Christmas.
