SAINT OF THE MONTH: ST. DYMPHNA, MAY 15TH

LIVED: 7th Century

FEAST DAY: May 15th

PATRON: Mental Illness, Anxiety, and Victims of Incest

According to oral traditon, St. Dymphna was born in 7th Century Ireland to a devout catholic mother and a pagan father. At the age of fourteen, Dymphna took a vow of chastity and consecrated herself to Christ. During this period, Dymphna's mother passed away and her father experienced a rapid deterioration of his mental health due to the death.

Concerns grew to such severity for Damon - who was also the king of Oriel, a confederation of Irish tribes in what is to-day Northern Ireland - his counselors recommended that he remarry. Although Damon was still mourning for his wife, he agreed to this idea only if a women could be found that was as beautiful in comparison to his late wife.

Messengers were sent throughout his terriotry and other lands to find a women of noble birth that resembled his former wife. Upon none being found, it has been said according to oral tradition, that Damon's counselors began to whisper thoughts into his ear to marry his own daughter Dymphna who would be the

closest in resemblance.

So entranced was Damon with this twisted idea, that he began to suffer delusions of seeing only his wife when he looked upon Dymphna. From this point on, the idea of marrying his own fourteen year-old daughter was the sole obsession for Damon.

Upon hearing of this twisted plot, Dymphna fled the castle with a priest named Gerebran (who had also been her confessor) two trusted servants, and her father's court "fool". The brave group sailed out of Ireland to what is today Beligum, and settled in the village of Geel. Unfortunately, Dymphna's father discovered his daughters location

from the charity work she was preforming in the area with her family's wealth.

Damon, upon capturing her daughter, had Father Gerebran executed, and attempted to convince Dymphna to come back with him and commit to marriage. Upon Dymphna's refusal, Damon in an intense rage, struck Dymphna with his sword, killing his fifteen year old daughter

It is important to keep in mind that May is National Mental Health Awareness Month, and St. Dymphna's experience with mental health is one that is very approporiate both for the time and what the world has been

going through with COVID-19. Everyone faces battles with anxiety, or mental illness some in a later stage in life or some very early on. It is a silent illiness that often goes unnoticed and highmisunderstood. During this month of May, take a moment during your prayers to pray for those who are suffering from mental illiness, that they might find peace and comfort.
