Council Proposes Membership Dues Change

The Highland Council 1580 Board is proposing to change the annual dues for student members from \$30 to \$20. A student, in this case, is someone under the age of 23 who is a Full Time student in a college, university or trade school.

SENIOR KNIGHT OF THE MONTH

April's Senior Knight of the Month goes to a Brother Knight for his life-long commitment to the Church, his family, community and his fellow man.

For 65 years he has fully dedicated his entire life to the Church, to his brothers and sisters and to the faith of the

Catholic Church through Jesus Christ.

Below is more about this outstanding Christian and fellow Brother Knight.

He was ordained May 27, 1950. It was in Carlinville, Illinois - known as coal country - that he celebrated his first Mass, at St. Joseph Church. Coming from a large family, he learned very early about sharing and sacrifice. His family is a unique one, and in fact, his younger brother also chose to follow him on his road to Christianity and service.

After ordination, his first assignment was at St. Mary's Parish in Alton in 1950, where he stayed until 1954. After that, he was the assistant at Ss. Peter and Paul in Springfield and later was

assigned to St. John in Quincy. Other assignments included: St. Patrick in Grafton; St. Michael in Beltrees, and St. Lawrence in Greenville. He retired in 1994 at the age of 70.

This lifetime of service stands at 65 years, and still he serves his fellow man and Knights with prayers and intercession. On May 12, he was honored at the "Priests' Jubilee Celebration" at the Villa Maria Catholic Life Center, Springfield by fellow priests as well as the Most Reverend Thomas John Paprocki, Bishop of Springfield in Illinois.

It is with great appreciation that we have selected Father Anthony Schmidt as Council 1580's, May 2015 Senior Knight of the Month.

We have selected, as May's Knight of the Month, a Brother Knight who provides invaluable service to our nation's military service specifically, the US Air Force.

Our Brother Knight is commander of the 412th Communications Squadron and has been given the award for Field Grade Officer of the Year. He is a graduate of Highland High School and the University of Illinois. He is the son of Anthony and Donna Budde of Highland.

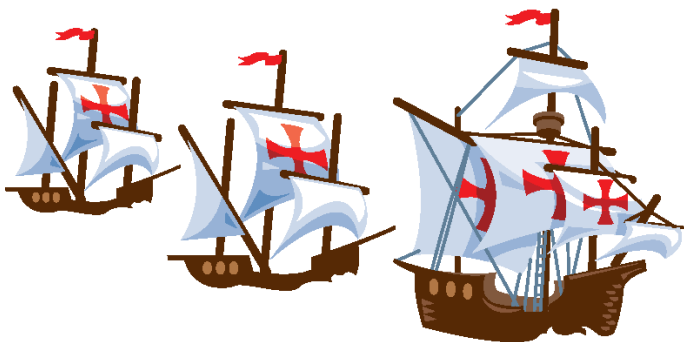
