HIGHLAND - The Highland Knights of Columbus hosted a Council Soccer Challenge October 11 and a District Soccer Challenge October 18 at Glik Park here.

Boys and girls age nine through 13 were invited to participate. The competition was designed for players to demonstrate the most basic soccer skill - the penalty kick.

In the Council Soccer Challenge, each participant was given 15 attempts to score at the soccer goal from a distance of 12 yards.

Two separate competitions were held for both boys and girls; however, each was scored in the same manner. The soccer goal was divided into five sections. When the ball was kicked, if it entered any of the upper corners of the soccer goal, the player scored 20 points. If the ball was kicked into the lower corners of the soccer goal, the player scored 10 points and if the player kicked the ball into the middle of the soccer goal, they scored five points. Each player's score was totaled to determine the winner by age group.
