FAMILY OF THE MONTH


We have selected as our February Family of the Month a brother Knight who continually contributes his time and talents to the Community, the Church and the Knights of Columbus.

Holy Family Prayer Program Set For March 15 At St. Paul Church



The Knights of Columbus is pleased to announce the 17th Orderwide prayer program featuring a pilgrim image as its centerpiece.

The Knights of Columbus inaugurated a new prayer program centered on the Holy Family, Aug. 4, 2015.

The intent of this prayer program is to strengthen Catholic families and their prayer lives.

The image is a copy of the etching of the Holy Family by Giovanni Balestra (1774-1842).

The original etching, which is based on a painting by Giovanni Battista Salvi da Sassoferato (1609–1685), is housed at the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for studies on Marriage and Family

The images were blessed by Pope Francis on June 29, 2015.

Since 1979, these rosary-based programs have included more than 147,000 prayer services and over 17 million participants.

This Holy Family Prayer Program is scheduled for Thursday, March 15 at 7 p.m. at St. Paul Church.

This will be a time of grace for all members and families in the Catholic community.
