DOUBLE YOUR IRA!

How would you like to double the value of your IRA overnight? What if you could make at least 50 per-

cent of its doubled value tax-free? I can tell you how to do just that.

I've noticed that many people age 65 to 70 who have IRAs have also done well in other areas of their financial lives. The nice part about this plan is that the money will still be available if your client needs it, in either the lifetime payment of the settlement option or the cash value of the life insurance.
