## DOUBLE YOUR IRA!

How would you like to double the value of your IRA overnight? What if you could make at least 50 percent of its doubled value tax-free? I can tell you how to do just that.

I've noticed that many people age 65 to 70 who have IRAs have also done well in other areas of their financial lives. Many of them would rather leave the IRA money in the account because they are earning enough money that they continue to pay income tax, and have no need for the IRA dollars at this time. Well Uncle Sam says their IRAs have to come out (starting at 70 1/2). There's no way around that. But what if they don't need the money when it comes out?

Then take the income this will produce and purchase a whole life policy. The life insurance death benefit should be more than the value of your IRA, and the death benefit is tax-free to you beneficiary. As the years go by, more and more of the total death benefit of the IRA-Life Insurance combination will become tax-free; after 15 years it will be 100 tax-free.

The nice part about this plan is that the money will still be available if your client needs it, in either the lifetime payment of the settlement option or the cash value of the life insurance.
