Queen Of Hearts Is Ready To Go!

The first raffle will be held at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Thursday night, June 21.



HIGHLAND - Many people are asking when will the Queen of Hearts begin?

The first raffle will be held at the Knights of Columbus Hall here, Thursday night, June 21.

How is it played?

First, you as a participant obtain a PIN "personal identification number" at the KC hall.

Initially, ticket sales and PIN registration will be done on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 5 to 8 p.m. of the two weeks preceding June 21. On raffle night ticket sales end at 7:30 pm. The drawing will be at 8 p.m.

The PIN number

The PIN number you receive is yours for the duration of the game. Once you have a PIN number you may purchase any number of tickets.

Write your PIN number on each of these tickets and place them in a provided receptacle. At the time of the drawing one of these tickets is pulled. If you are lucky, it will be yours. At that point you have a decision to make. The first week of the game there will be a board with 54 playing cards pasted and sealed face down. You select which card space you want uncovered. If you are lucky again, you selected the space that holds the Queen of Hearts. That means you win the jackpot.

If it is not the Queen of Hearts, you will receive a cash

consolation prize.

If you are not present at the time of the drawing, a card will be selected for you.

If the Queen of Hearts is reveled, you will receive one-half of the week's jackpot.

The other half will be added to the jackpot of the new game, beginning the next week.

The Rules Displayed

Highland Knights of Columbus Queen of Hearts rules will be displayed and readily available at event times. Ray Korte, Carl Lammers and Denis Thole spearheaded the startup of this event and fellow KC members have been very supportive.

The City of Highland approached approval of a Queen of Hearts drawing very cautiously.

A number of meetings were held with them which led to the present city ordinance.

Many people attended the organizational and preliminary meetings, where good ideas were shared.

Several of KC members stepped forward to chair some of the different committees.

A good set of rules was compiled in hopes of avoiding problems that other communities have experienced. The Knights are so fortunate that they have a good mix of skill-sets: members with business, professional, promotional and creative experience.

The KC Ladies Auxiliary will be selling food on raffle nights.

Preparation of food, ordering of supplies and other items will be handled by Dave Gall, the hall manager.

The Queen of Hearts Committee is excited about this new

venture.

Who Are the **Knights of** Columbus?

During the past decade, the Knights of Columbus has donated more than \$1.325 billion to charity.

The Knights of Columbus set new all-time records for charitable donations and volunteer service hours in 2008.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors. The Knights' annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2008, indicates that, despite a soft economy, total charitable contributions reached \$150,036,865 - exceeding the previous year's total by more than \$5.1 million.

The figure includes \$32,295,376 donated by the Supreme Council, and \$117,741,489 in contributions from state and local councils assemblies and Squires circles.

The survey also indicated that the quantity of volunteer service hours to charitable causes by Knights grew to 87,885 hours compared to 2007.

There were more than 413,000 Knights of Columbus blood donations during the year and, among the most common service programs, Habitat for Humanity received 156,295 K of C volunteer hours.

The Knights of Columbus has been promoting a Year of the Volunteer and sponsored a summit on volunteerism,

A Nation of Neighbors Helping Neighbors, in New York Feb. 27, to promoted increased participation and collaboration in volunteer efforts from individuals and organizations.
