On or about 1980, our Brother Knight began taking meals to Sts. Peter and Paul homeless shelter in St. Louis, Mo. Also, in 1994 he started taking 8th grade students to a men's shelter as a service project for Confirmation. The students shop for food, prepare the food at a student's home and then take it to the shelter setting it up buffet style to serve the homeless men. On Sunday's, under our Brother's direction, groups of 5 or 6 students and 2 parents prepare food for some 60 to 70 men. Also, on two Wednesdays of the month, our Brother takes meals provided by the St. Vincent DePaul Society to St. Louis as well.

Our Brother Knight is committed to helping persons with disabilities as he reads current news stories to persons who are visually impaired "On Air" at the radio station at Our Lady of the Snows Shrine. He is truly dedicated and makes it his priority to help his fellow man any way he can. Additionally, he is a Lector at St. Paul Parish.

A Founding Notion: Protecting the Breadwinner's Income

While jobs may be safer in 2014, accidents, injuries, and illnesses that can impact your ability to work still happen. Most, in fact, do not happen on the jobsite or place of employment.
