Landmann Nominated to Illinois Knights of Columbus 'Hall of Fame'

HIGHLAND - Once again Highland Knights of Columbus Council 1580 has good reason to be proud of a very dedicated member - Orville Landmann.

In an effort to sum up his years of service, the Grand Knight recently sent a nomination letter to the Hall of Fame Committee.

"In the short period of time I have known Orville Landmann, he continually demonstrates that he is truly deserving of this honor," said Grand Knight Joe Wetmore.

"Please accept this nomination letter for Sir Knight Orville Landmann from Highland Knights of Columbus 1580 and Assembly 0231. Our devoted Brother joined the Knights of Columbus in 1965 and the Fourth Degree Assembly in 1973. He quickly became involved in many areas of the council," wrote Wetmore.

"Our Brother was Chairman of the Hall Building Committee and helped collect some \$50,000 required to facilitate a bank loan providing funds to construct our new building. Once the new hall was completed, our Brother built the stage in the banquet area and also assisted in the construction of the walk-in cooler."

Landmann received a certificate for an outstanding job overseeing the construction of the new hall from general contractor Korte Construction Company. He has also served as bartender for many years on Friday and Saturday evenings, and was in charge of the coat room for eight years. He has been the Chairman of Bingo since its inception in 1977 and has worked almost every Wednesday night for the past 38 years. He also takes care of the Thursday euchre nights.

For the past 21 years, he has worked four to five nights a week opening and closing the KC Hall, working close to 75 hours per month; never accepting any compensation for his time.

As a dedicated Knight, he also volunteers his time for many of the fundraisers such as: Intellectual Disabilities 'Tootsie Roll' Drive, St. Jude "Wheels of Life" and for three years he was Chairman for the Knights of Columbus Council food stand at the Madison County Fair.

For eight years, he was the Chairman for the downstate

Additionally, this Brother Knight served as the Council Treasurer for 37 years.

He is a member of the Honor Guard and has participated in all related functions therein.

He attends the living rosaries, funeral prayer service, visitations, and mass regularly.

He routinely volunteers for the Lenten Fish Fry's, chicken

and sausage dinners, and has worked the food stands at the Schweizerfest and Kirchenfest which are held annually in Highland.

Landmann is also a past President of the Columbus Club.

In addition to the KC's, he has also served as Commander of the Highland VFW.

The wine and beer tasting committee is now in place and has had its' first meeting. Information regarding this event will be published in the next month's newsletter.


