We have selected, as April's Knight of the Month, a Brother Knight who provides service and support to the Church, the Community and our Knights of Columbus Council.

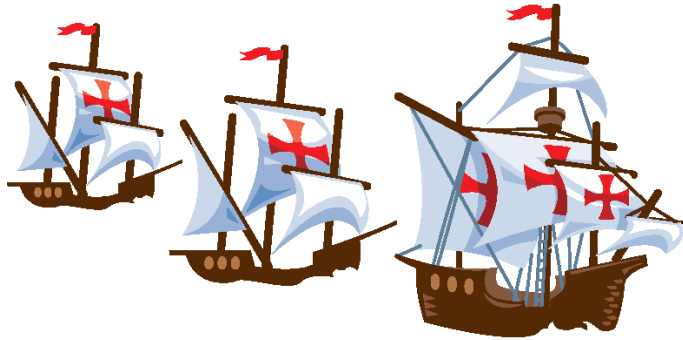
As one of our newer members, this Brother Knight has just completed becoming fully vested within our order.
