

NOTES FROM THE CHANCELLOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Many years ago, I heard a term that I shrugged off at the time, but woke up thinking about just the other day. I once asked an individual what religion they practiced. The response I received was that they were a 'retired' Catholic. I thought to myself, "What does that mean?" Once an individual retires from a particular position such as a doctor or lawyer, then they can no longer practice that position. If one refers to themself as a retired Catholic, would it be safe to assume that they do not practice their faith according to how the Catholic Church dictates; i.e. regularly attending Holy Mass on Sunday's, receiving the Holy Eucharist, going to Confession and so forth? I have heard over the years, many Priests comment on how the church seems to be a bit more crowded during the Christmas and Lenten Season. During this Lenten Season, the church asks for all of us to fast, to pray and to give alms. 
