FOURTH DEGREE HISTORY

When Father Michael J. McGivney and his closely knit band of followers founded the Knights of Columbus (1882), they obviously had the Fourth Degree in mind as the final step of Columbianism.

In New Haven, Connecticut, as well as n other parts of the country, a need was felt for an association of Catholic men, cleared of any suspicions that they lacked patriotism, divorced absolutely from politics, and observing undying fidelity to the Church.

So it was that on February 22, 1900, the first Fourth Degree exemplification was held in New York City. The ritual added patriotism to the original principles of the Order: charity, unity, and fraternity.

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and generating a love of country through membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies.

The Highland Assembly 0231 was begun May 1938. We are proud to say that, this month, we celebrate 75 years as an Assembly of the Knights of Columbus.
