senting flags, not only to honor the heroes and victims of September 11, 2001 but also the men and women of our Armed Forces serving in combat, he said.

"In addition, these ceremonies pay tribute to the men and women in this community who risk their lives daily to keep us safe - police officers, fire fighters and emergency rescue personnel and other First Responders," and added, "they all deserve our thanks and admiration."

More than 5,000 flagpoles have been dedicated to these heroes in special ceremonies held by Woodmenlife chapters.

Hundreds more will be dedicated this year. "Patriotism is at the very core of Woodmen life - it is the fabric that makes us who we are," he said.

For more than 125 years, Woodmenlife have striven to promote family, community and country. Since 1947, their chapters have presented more than 2.5 million American flags to community-based organizations across this nation.

The commemorative plaque at the base of the pole reads: "In Honor and Remembrance of the heroes and victims in the fight against terrorism and to celebrate the enduring spirit of all Americans. Presented by members of Woodmen life."

As the flag was being raised, and then lowered to half staff, everyone observed a moment of silence. The flagpole stands near the baseball fields which some call Viking Field as more students from St. Paul Catholic School play ball.
