Highland Knights of Columbus Support Newman, Vocations, Pro-life Activities

HIGHLAND - The Highland Knights of Columbus are very active as they continue their quest to support activities such as Respect For Life, the Newman Fund, and the vocations of seminarians, sisters, those seeking vocation of religious life and priests.

St. Paul Parish and the Knights of Columbus Council 1580 welcomed Most Reverend Thomas John Paprocki, Bishop of the Springfield Diocese, to Highland. Sunday, Feb. 15.

Bishop Paprocki celebrated Mass at St. Paul and afterward, approximately 125 members of the Knights of Columbus Council 1580, the Highland Community, and several members of the clergy gathered at the Knights of Columbus Hall for the annual fundraiser luncheon and a program.

Grand Knight of Council 1580, Joe Wetmore presented 24 seminarians and religious, a \$500 check for each of them as well as an additional check for \$2,500 to the Springfield Diocese Office of Vocations. This supporting check was on behalf of KC members and the Highland

community.

Additionally, \$2,000 was donated by the Madison County Bowl for Charity to be put toward seminarian education.

Featured speakers talked about vocations, Newman campus ministries, and Pro-Life Activities.

Speakers included: Rev. Brian C. Alford, Ron Ziemba, PSD on Vocations Activities, Sister Jane Boos on Respect for Life, Larry Theriault on Right To Life, Newman Chairman Jim Coglianese, Don Lohman, Council 1580 Church Director on gratitude.

For the work of supporting Right To Life, Sister Boos exclaimed "Thank You, Thank You, Thank You!"

The keynote speaker was Bishop Paprocki who said that all of the programs may be seen as separate, but are actually connected. He added that all of the work that is being done by many were "connecting the dots and that "the kids are open to the faith and to serving" because of all of these activities

Vocations are indeed alive and well in Highland and the Springfield Diocese!
