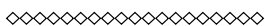

COUNCIL 1580 HOSTS EXEMPLIFICATION

On Sunday, May 23rd, Highland Council #1580 organized and executed its first public exemplification. As discussed in our newsletter earlier this year, the Knights of Columbus exemplification is the newly reorganized initiation ceremony of the Order of the Knights of Columbus, replacing the previous tradition of initiating a prospective brother through a series of three private degrees teaching the orders lessons. Like with many fraternal organizations during

its time, this tradition was carried through by many of the Orders contemporary fraternal organizations such as the Independent Order of the Odd Fellows, the Knights of Pythias, and the other societies such as collegiate fraternities and sororities that use a Greek Motif. Although the changes appear to break from tradition, these are positive signs that the Order is keeping up with the times that our society currently lives in. By the supreme councils conception, the exemplification process takes exactly 45 minutes to execute while still instructing the newly incoming

knights the values in which the Order was founded upon by the direction of Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney. Although the veil of secrecy has been lifted from the Orders Initiation Practices, and transitioned to this new exemplification process, it opens the way for family to become more directly involved with the Orders activities by creating a shared experience the newly vested knights. This in truth, puts the most emphasis on the importance of family and the vital role in keeping our parish community alive.
