

# **Grand Knight The First Three Things**

This is my first Grand Knight's Message and even though I have only

been on the

job for about a month I have learned a lot. Many have asked me if I have any big plans? I do. Here are the three things I think about the most.

I was reviewing some insurance documents I found out there was 194 KC events scheduled for 2017!

These included 50 Bingos, 12 Officer Meetings, 12 Council Meetings, 8 Fish Fries, 1 Bishop's Dinner, 3 days at the Schweizerfest, 5 days at the Madison County Fair, and 4 days at the Kirchenfest plus many more.

All those events will likely take place in 2018 with the addition of 50 Queen of Hearts drawings, bringing the total to 244!

If you include the planning meetings and set up work required to support all those events it turns out that there is something going on almost every day.

That's a good thing.

It's a sign of a vibrant council. If you walk into the KC Hall on a Thursday evening before the Queen of Hearts drawing you can feel the buzz in the air and the roar of a crowd that's happy to be there. I'm proud to be a part of it.

The down side is all those events takes a lot of workers. I've notice many of our members don't sign up to work but they usually show up to work.

Now let's talk about money. Many of our events are fund raising events.

If our events are more successful, then we have more money to support organizations and causes consistent with our Catholic faith.

More money for pro-life organizations.

More money for Catholic schools.

More money for seminarians.

More money to assist people with intellectual disabilities. More money for our parish.

The second thing I would like to improve upon is getting our membership, our parish and the Highland Community to better support our fundraisers. We should be serving twice as many fish dinners during Lent and have twice as many Bingo players as we currently do. Let's figure out why and fix it.

I became a Catholic in 1977 but dodged becoming a knight until 23 years later. I think there are a lot of men in our parish in the same boat. For 15 years after becoming a knight I did little more than pay my dues.

Then I figured out that the guys I liked, the guys I trusted, the guys who were good to their families, the guys I could count on, and the guys who took their Catholic faith seriously were all knights. That's why I got more involved and that's why I became an officer.

The third thing I would like to improve upon is building our membership by helping the men of our parish find a mission within the Knights of Columbus where their talents can be used to serve their council, their parish and their families.

The Knight's of Columbus have never asked me to do something I couldn't do.


