Not huge increases, although even small increases help to offset the costs for hall improvements and upkeep.

The hall rental fee for 2023 is \$3,000, this will increase to \$3,500 in 2024.

11. In regard to service baldrics and swords – Please check with the Assembly 231 to see if any are available. These items are donated back periodically from families of deceased Sir Knights.
