Daniel Oberreuter Sings At St. Paul Mass', Rocks Knights of Columbus Hall

HIGHLAND - Catholic Evangelism singer Daniel Oberreuter brought his unique style of Catholic entertainment to St. Paul Church and also played an afternoon concert at the KC Hall here.

Oberreuter was the only figure on the stage, but still produced a solid performance as well as a strong Christian message.

He and his band, The Thirsting, played in St. Louis Saturday night. Band members went on to other commitments, but Oberreuter stayed behind and traveled here just to bring his powerful ministry to Highland.

Oberreuter is the lead singer and formed the band 2006.

In his performance, it was easy to see his devotion to the faith through his music.

Oberreuter and his band, The Thirsting wants catholics to love and follow Jesus Christ, through the Eucharist, Mary

and the rosary, and to encourage Catholics to live, love, and follow all of the teachings of the catholic church.

After the concert many people stopped to talk with him, to have a tee-shirt or CD

A single spotlight highlighted Oberreuter and his guitar as he weaved his songs in and out of his message of redemption and his devotion to Mary and the rosary, and her Son, Jesus Christ.

"My family would watch TV and I would go into the my room to pray the rosary. It was through the rosary that I discovered who Jesus really is," he said.


